- C: Too often, we imagine you only in these traditional biblical scenes, instead of looking for you in our everyday lives: in our workplaces, our places of worship, and our homes. Forgive us. Open our hearts, eyes, and ears to encounter you today. Ready our hearts to shout "Glory," when we hear your voice and see your work in our lives. Too often, we acknowledge your holy identity, but we forget that we share in your baptism. Forgive us. Remind us again this day that we are claimed as God's children and are sent to show the love and justice we see in you. Amen.

- C: We too are called by God: God knows us, loves us, claims and names us. We are beloved and empowered! Thanks be to God!



Baptism

P: God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. By water and the Word God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.



Parents, Jack and Melissa Mesce and Godparents, Nikolai Sherer and Francine Mesce and I present Lilliann Francis Mesce to receive the Sacrament of Holy Baptism.

- 1) Child of blessing, child of promise, baptized with the Spirit's sign: With this water God has sealed you unto love and grace divine.

- P: Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?
- C: I renounce them.
- P: Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?
- C: I renounce them.
- P: Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?
- C: I renounce them.

Thanksgiving

- *P: The Lord be with you.*
- C: And also with you.

The Psalm

Psalm 29, NIV



Psalm 29 draws attention to the creative power of God's voice and reminds us that God's word has the power to shape all of creation. As we read it in concert with the description of Jesus' baptism, we are struck again with the image of the fire and the Holy Spirit, and we are reminded of the power of the words from heaven to remake all of creation through the shaping of Jesus' ministry. ¹ Ascribe to the Lord, you heavenly beings,

ascribe to the Lord glory and strength.

² Ascribe to the Lord the glory due to his name; worship the Lord in the splendour of his holiness.

³ The voice of the Lord is over the waters; the God of glory thunders, the Lord thunders over the mighty waters.

4 The voice of the Lord is powerful; the voice of the Lord is majestic.

⁵ The voice of the Lord breaks the cedars;

the Lord breaks in pieces the cedars of Lebanon.

⁶ He makes Lebanon leap like a calf, Sirion like a young wild ox.

⁷ The voice of the Lord strikes with flashes of lightning.

⁸ The voice of the Lord shakes the desert; the Lord shakes the Desert of Kadesh.

⁹ The voice of the Lord twists the oaksand strips the forests bare. And in his temple all cry, 'Glory!'

¹⁰ The Lord sits enthroned over the flood; the Lord is enthroned as King for ever.

¹¹ The Lord gives strength to his people; the Lord blesses his people with peace.

The Epistle Lesson

Acts 8:14-17

As we read this passage alongside the account of the baptism of Jesus, we realize that it was not the power of the water, nor the power of John the baptizer's words, but the power of the Holy Spirit with us that changes the focus of our lives.

¹⁴Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them. ¹⁵The two went down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit ¹⁶(for as yet the Spirit had not come upon any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus). ¹⁷Then Peter and John laid their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.



The Gospel Lesson

The Gospel of Luke begins with the intertwined lives and extraordinary births of John the Baptist and Jesus the Christ. Our narrative picks up at the point that the crowds confuse John's role and wonder whether he might be the Christ. As a response, he declares his expectation of someone greater than him, whose shoes he is unworthy to untie.

Luke 3:15-17, 21-22, NIV

***Gospel Acclamation**



P: Listen to the Gospel of Jesus Christ according to Luke. **C: Glory to you, O Lord.**

¹⁵As the people were filled with expectation, and all were Questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, ¹⁶John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. ¹⁷His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

²¹Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, ²²and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."


Prayer of the Day
