
The Congregational Response

Scriptures (Scripture Verses are NSRV unless otherwise stated)

The Old Testament Lesson

Job 23:1-9, 16-17

This passage comes in the middle of the conversation between Job and his three friends. The friends give Job lots of advice about how he should deal with his suffering but they never try and intercede on his behalf (as God tells them in chapter 42 they should have done). The poetic form of the language used can make it difficult for a modern reader to really get to grips with this text, but Job teaches us how to lament, an important part of our spiritual vocabulary. ¹Job answered [his friend:] ²"Today also my complaint is bitter; [God's] hand is heavy despite my groaning. ³Oh, that I knew where I might find him, that I might come even to his dwelling! ⁴I would lay my case before him, and fill my mouth with arguments. ⁵I would learn what

he would answer me, and understand what he would say to me. ⁶Would he contend with me in the greatness of his power? No; but he would give heed to me. ⁷There an upright person could reason with him, and I should be acquitted forever by my judge. ⁸"If I go forward, he is not there;

or backward, I cannot perceive him; ⁹on the left he hides, and I cannot behold him; I turn to the right, but I cannot see him. ¹⁶God has made my heart faint; the Almighty has terrified me; ¹⁷If only I could vanish in darkness, and thick darkness would cover my face!"

The Psalm

Psalm 22:1-15

Jesus prayed this individual lament from the cross (Matthew 27:46; Mark 15:34). In the opening of the Psalm, we hear a cry from the psalmist. There is not anger, but rather, sadness in the words, a longing for God in moments of brokenness.

¹My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why so far from saving me, so far from the words of my groaning? ²My God, I cry out by day, but you do not answer; by night, but I find no rest. ³Yet you are the Holy One, enthroned on the praises of Israel. ⁴Our ancestors put their trust in you, they trusted, and you rescued them. ⁵They cried out to you and were delivered; they trusted in you and were not put to shame. ⁶But as for me, I am a worm and not human, scorned by all and despised by the people. ⁷All who see me laugh me to scorn; they curl their lips; they shake their heads. ⁸"Trust in the LORD; let the LORD deliver; let God rescue him if God so delights in him." ⁹Yet you are the one who drew me forth from the womb,

and kept me safe on my mother's breast.

- ¹⁰I have been entrusted to you ever since I was born; you were my God when I was still in my mother's womb.
- ¹¹Be not far from me, for trouble is near, and there is no one to help.
- ¹²Many young bulls encircle me; strong bulls of Bashan surround me.
- ¹³They open wide their jaws at me, like a slashing and roaring lion.
- ¹⁴I am poured out like water; all my bones are out of joint; my heart within my breast is melting wax.
- ¹⁵My strength is dried up like a potsherd; my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth; and you have laid me in the dust of death.

The Epistle Lesson

Hebrews 4:12-16

We cannot hide our thoughts, desires, and actions from God, to whom we are completely accountable. Nevertheless, Jesus understands our human weakness and temptations, because he also experienced them. Therefore we can approach the throne of grace to receive divine mercy from Christ.

¹²Indeed, the word of God is living and active, sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing until it divides soul from spirit, joints from marrow; it is able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart. ¹³And before him no creature is hidden, but all are naked and laid bare to the eyes of the one to whom we must render an account. ¹⁴Since, then, we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast to our confession. ¹⁵For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin. ¹⁶Let us therefore approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need. **C: Thanks be to God.**


The Gospel Lesson

Mark 10:17-31

Jesus has been teaching his disciples about what is most valued in God's eyes. Now, a conversation with a rich man brings his message home to the disciples in a way that is surprising but unforgettable.

¹⁷As [Jesus] was setting out on a journey, a man ran up and knelt before him, and asked him, "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" ¹⁸Jesus said to him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. ¹⁹You know the commandments: 'You shall not murder; You shall not commit adultery; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; You shall not defraud; Honor your father and mother.'" ²⁰He said to him, "Teacher, I have kept all these since my youth." ²¹Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said, "You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." ²²When he heard this, he was shocked and went away grieving, for he had many possessions.

²³Then Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How hard it will be for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!"

²⁴And the disciples were perplexed at these words. But Jesus said to them again, "Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! ²⁵It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." ²⁶They were greatly astounded and said to one another, "Then who can be saved?" ²⁷Jesus looked at them and said, "For mortals it is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible."

²⁸Peter began to say to him, "Look, we have left everything and followed you." ²⁹Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, there is no one who

has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or fields, for my sake and for the sake of the good news, ³⁰who will not receive a hundredfold now in this age—houses, brothers and sisters, mothers and children, and fields, with persecutions—and in the age to come eternal life. ³¹But many who are first will be last, and the last will be first."
